

From the Minister



A Christmas Welcome

As we approach Christmas it is all too easy to bask in nostalgia, which, as I've said before, isn't what it used to be! The story of the Nativity has been, over the years, condensed, sanitised and simplified so that the Nativity story that is familiar to many, bears little

relation to what may have actually taken place. Much of what we see, especially in school and church nativity plays, regarding 'Wise Men', shepherds, 'the stable' and the assortment of animals on show is largely unsupported by the text.

Part of the accepted tradition is that Mary gives birth in a stable because "there was no room at the inn". Leaving aside the fact there is no mention of an innkeeper there is also no mention of an inn. The word readily translated as 'inn' can equally mean a room reserved for guests or for special occasions. It is the same word that Mark uses for the room where Jesus celebrated Passover the night before his death. This was in the days when, in the Middle East, poorer people lived on a raised platform in their houses with animals at ground level. The room mentioned would have been a portion set aside for visitors or guests.

There has always been a strong tradition of hospitality in the Middle East and it is unsurprising that in Bethlehem, with so many arriving for census, 'guest rooms' would be occupied by other visitors. Wherever Mary and Joseph arrived, it is likely that the house was already a hospitable one and the space had already been taken.

Considering this, it is likely that Mary may have given birth among animals, probably in the lower part of the house and quite possibly at one of Joseph's relatives, even if a distant one. If true it is unlikely Mary would have been alone. It is probable that other female family members of the house would have been present to assist in the birth.

From the Minister

I think this can have significance for us today. The Christ Child, God with us, was welcomed into a family home, one which had probably already opened its doors to others. Despite being full that home was now willing to stretch that offer of hospitality to include some, perhaps unfamiliar, or even unknown, family members or unknown people who were in need. The metaphor for us as individuals, as a country and as a nation is striking. As refugees move across the globe, attempting to flee violence and seeking safety we cannot help but think of Jesus' flight to Egypt as a young child.

This Christmas, as we offer and enjoy hospitality to family and friends – and, perhaps, are challenged by the Christmas story to extend our welcome beyond the usual – let us not forget that Christmas very likely starts in a home, and one which is generous and hospitable in its welcome.

The Kirk Session met on Tuesday 26 August 2025.

Mrs Moira Purves

The Clerk paid tribute to Moira Purves who passed away on 24 June in Strachan House. Moira had been a lifetime member of our Church and had occupied many roles and was involved in many of the activities taking place.

Building For The Future (BFTF) 2

Kirk Session has been considering how the residual monies (c £80,000) from the earlier BFTF project should be used. A number of meetings have been held and the view is that the priorities should be (not in this order)

- 1. Extending the Audio Visual to the halls
- 2. Upgrading the toilets
- 3. The entrance to the halls.

There will be an update for the Congregation at morning worship on 26 October. There will be a future opportunity for members to expound their views and ask questions while hearing more of what is being contemplated.

Kirk Session Report

Fabric

Readers will recall that an incident occurred in the Sanctuary and halls late in the afternoon of Tuesday 11 February following the upgrading of our meter to a new meter. This was at the request of Scottish Power with the work carried out by a sub-contractor.

When the work was completed and the power reconnected, there was a surge in power or some form of unbalanced restoration of the supply to the various distribution boards. This resulted in significant damage across the building and in particular to the heating pumps and lighting

It has cost the Church circa £35,000 to make good the damage caused. The total cost thereof has more or less all been recouped from our insurance company.

Ferryhill Primary School

Michael Cockburn introduced this item concerning the support we have been providing to the Food Shelf within the school. The need for donations is greater than ever and has been exasperated by the closure of Pennywell Pantry putting the Ferryhill parents in a worse situation. Currently we have been providing support on an informal basis, with Kevin Russell, our Church Officer, delivering our donations each week and Michael, James Burr, Pat McLeod and Rosi Watt helping especially at school holidays when donations are sent to Drylaw Neighbourhood Centre. Michael proposed and it was agreed by Session that we should formalise arrangements and assure Ferryhill PS that we will provide support throughout the 2025/26 academic year, school holidays included.

Life and Work

The Moderator confirmed that, following the decision taken at this year's General Assembly, there would be no more Life and Work magazines in printed form. He thanked Alison Hewat for all her work over a number of years in organising their distribution via District Elders.

Finance

It was noted that Sandy Weir was stepping down after a number of years faithful and diligent service, for which he was thanked, as Gift Aid Convenor. Kirk Session agreed that Susan Scrimgeur be appointed as Sandy's successor.

Organist

It was agreed that Elizabeth Smith be appointed as deputy organist. Elizabeth is well known to us having deputised for Donald Cameron on a number of occasions and is a member of the Choir.

Presbytery Plan

There have been no developments to report to Kirk Session. The ball continues to remain in the court of the Presbytery Deployment of Resources Committee.

A Personal Remembrance by Adrian Johnston

A Personal Remembrance

The taxi arrived at 4am! My brother and sister were already in it and with Catriona, we four were off to France to fulfill a long-held intention to visit the grave of my Dad's cousin, after whom I had been named.

Lt Adrian Alexander Hope Johnston of the Middlesex Regiment had been killed on the first day of the Battle of the Somme just three weeks before his 20th birthday. I think it unlikely that any other family member had visited his grave. Before being posted to France and fresh out of RMA Sandhurst, he had visited my Dad at his boarding school resplendent in his uniform and made a big impression on his younger cousin.

Ryanair are famous for flying to airports miles from the major city they purport to fly to, but on this occasion, the flight to (Paris) Beauvais was exactly where we wanted to be. We hired a car and drove on the nearly deserted country roads to the Gordon Dump Cemetery at Ovillers-La-Boisselle near Arras.

By pure chance, I had learned from Michael Cockburn that his Grandfather's brother is buried in the same cemetery. He also died on 1st July 1916. There are 1,676 British and Commonwealth servicemen of the First World War buried or commemorated in this cemetery. 1,053 of the burials are unidentified. Considering that around 125,000 British and Commonwealth servicemen died over the 141 days of the battle, both Adrian Johnston and George Cockburn being in the same cemetery is quite a coincidence.

Fergus had given us remembrance crosses to place at the two graves and with some solemnity we placed them and stood in a few moments of silence. If you have visited a Commonwealth Graves Commission cemetery, you will know how well maintained and peaceful they are. It was a poignant experience that made an impression that will be with us for a long time.

A Personal Remembrance by Adrian Johnston

The next day we had booked a Somme battlefield tour with a British ex-soldier who lives in France. His knowledge of the battle seemed encyclopedic. He had researched where the 4th Battalion Middlesex Regiment had fought and looked up the burial records for Lt Adrian Johnston as well as consulted the battalion's war diary. He was able to take us to the field where Adrian was killed and was originally buried until in 1919 when he was exhumed and moved to the Gordon Dump Cemetery. Another unexpectedly emotional moment. It is 109 years since this young man died, along with thousands of others, fighting for his country and yet being in the exact place it all happened made it personal and current.

Since returning to the UK, we have learned a lot more about Lt Adrian Johnston and his short military service. Going to France to the location of his part in the battle and visiting his grave has fully vindicated my wish to honour the memory of the man for whom I am a namesake.

Bring some joy to an underprivileged child this year with the gift of a Christmas Shoebox!




You are invited once again to collect a flat-packed shoe box from the table at the back of the Sanctuary. Full instructions on how to fill your shoebox will be provided.


We are excited to be involved in this project and please put the date in your diary now and we look forward to seeing you all there on 21st at 7pm.






